National Immunisation Program (NIP) schedule for Shingles (see reference):

From 1 November 2023, the shingles vaccine Shingrix® replaced Zostavax® on the National Immunisation Program (NIP) schedule for the prevention of shingles and post-herpetic neuralgia. It will be available for eligible people most at risk of complications from shingles.

A 2-dose course of Shingrix® will be available for free for:

- · people aged 65 years and older
- First Nations people aged 50 years and older
- immunocompromised people aged 18 years and older with the following medical conditions:
 - o haemopoietic stem cell transplant
 - o solid organ transplant
 - haematological malignancy
 - o advanced or untreated HIV.


